Antony's career started very early on in life with a television role as a pupil in Steven Moffat's sitcom 'Chalk'. He then went on to appear in 'Grange Hill' and 'The Bill'. Whilst Antony showed immense acting talent from an early age, he's other big passion was music and with a great singing voice he and three friends formed a band that became one of the world's most successful boy bands – 'Blue'.

After many successful years on the road, the boys decided to pursue solo careers whilst remaining great friends.

Antony released his debut solo single called "Do You Ever Think of Me" in February 2006. He went on to compete in the 2006 Eurovision: Making Your Mind Up programme to find a competitor to represent the UK in the Eurovision Song Contest 2006 with "It's a Beautiful Thing".

On stage, Antony played the lead role of Mickey Johnstone in the long-running musical Blood Brothers in London's West End, directed and produced by Bill Kenwright. Antony then toured the UK in the tenth anniversary tour of Boogie Nights.

Antony was invited to meet (then) Prime Minister Tony Blair at the celebrations of the arrival of ten new members into the European Union. He was a contestant on the 2005 series of 'I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out Of Here!'

In 2009, Blue announced that they would reform & they returned to the stage this summer at the Capital Radio 'Summertime Ball' and headlined with the Legendary Lionel Richie.

Alongside the reformation of 'Blue', Antony is pursuing his acting, he recently starred at the Edinburgh Festival in Bloodbath The Musical, and will star in BBC drama Casualty on 21st November as a guest lead.
